

Local School District Fruitport Community Schools Operating Millage Renewal Proposal This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its full revenue per pupil foundation allowance and renews millage that will expire with the 2020 tax levy. The remaining .5 mill is only available to be levied to restore millage lost as a result of a reduction required by the "Headlee" amendment to the Michigan Constitution of 1963, and will only be levied to the extent necessary to restore that reduction. Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of 18.5 mills (\$18.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Fruitport Community Schools, Muskegon and Ottawa Counties, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 4 years, 2021 to 2024, inclusive, to provide funds for operating


